

We know that life can be hard when you're coping with a long-term condition like kidney disease, and it can affect your ability to work and to live life to the full. Ensuring that you are getting the benefits support that you are entitled to can make a real difference.

Welfare and benefits support

It's easy to feel overwhelmed when applying for support due to the number of benefits available, and their requirements. Patient Support & Advocacy Officers (PSAOs) can give you advice on the benefits and entitlements available to you. They can also organise a free Welfare and Benefits Health Check to identify which benefits you could be claiming.

Advice about money and energy

Working with the PSAOs, the Money & Energy Advice team can help you to check that you are getting all that you could be allowed. Our expert team know how CKD changes your life and can help you to navigate welfare benefits, grants, and other financial support.

They can also suggest ways you can cut costs through smarter energy usage, helping to make your home warmer and save you money.



Online help

Our online tools can help check if you are receiving all the benefits you are entitled to and give advice on how to apply. You can also talk to your local Patient Support & Advocacy Officer to go through your situation.

Kidney Care UK grants



Financial grants can help you to avert a crisis, buy a necessity, or give you the chance to take a much-needed break.

Kidney Care UK grants are one-off payments towards some of the extra costs that kidney disease can cause. You don't need to pay back a grant. Grants are available for patients whose health and quality of life is being seriously affected by their condition (for example, dialysis patients on low incomes, transplant patients and those receiving conservative care).

Each application for a grant is assessed on a case-by-case basis, and while we can't guarantee every application will result in a grant, we do our best to help where we can. In 2023 alone, we awarded more than £800,000 in grants.

We provide grants to give a helping hand for a variety of situations, such as:

- Replacing essential household items including furniture or kitchen appliances
- Enabling home dialysis by providing practical storage or comfortable seating
- · Contributing towards mobility aids
- Helping with travel costs to specialist hospital appointments out of area
- Meeting additional needs to maintain a warm, safe home
- Contributing towards a much-needed holiday or respite break
- Supporting training, education or equipment to support your wellbeing or help you gain employment





Talking to a Kidney Care UK counsellor



Finding out that you have a chronic condition and living with the day-to-day impact can be very difficult. Family members can feel anxious and isolated too. Whether you are struggling to come

to terms with having kidney disease, you are worried about treatment or you simply feel overwhelmed, our specialist kidney counsellors are here for patients and their families.

The counselling service is available via telephone or video call (such as Zoom) on Monday to Friday and is free to use. Following an initial counselling assessment, we provide up to six weekly sessions, usually lasting 50 minutes each.

Be part of the kidney community



Whether you want to chat with people in a similar situation to you, or discuss your kidney journey, our private Facebook support group has over 12,000 members who are all affected

by kidney disease in some way. The group is moderated, so it is a safe place to discuss any issues you may have with people who understand.

Kidney Kitchen

We have worked with dietitians and food experts to create hundreds of delicious kidney-friendly recipes you can enjoy eating every day and at every stage of kidney disease.



Each recipe is carefully analysed and approved by the British Dietetic Association Renal Nutrition Specialist Group (RNG) and features nutritional information so you can select the recipes according to the dietary advice you have been given by your dietitian.

Support from your utility companies

Anyone living with a long-term or serious illness, such as chronic kidney disease (CKD), is eligible to sign up to the Priority Services Register (PSR). It's completely free, and once you've signed up, you can stay on it for as long as you like.

The PSR is a free UK wide service which provides extra help during power cuts or when there's an interruption to your electricity, gas or water supply.

Joining the PSR helps your utility companies to provide adapted services, adjust communications and make amendments to keep you safe, such as setting up a password scheme and providing advance warning of planned interruptions to electricity, gas or water supplies.

Working together

Kidney Care UK works with many different utility companies across the UK, to raise awareness of CKD and how living with the disease impacts people's lives.

Keeping safe and warm

Everyone should feel safe and warm in their own home, but some people with long-term conditions, like kidney disease, may find it harder because they struggle to pay the bills or may be more frail due to their condition. Special types of advice and help can give you peace of mind at home.

Carbon monoxide is a colourless gas that is produced if fuels, such as natural gas, don't burn properly or rooms are not well ventilated to let the gas escape. A build-up of carbon monoxide in your home can be very dangerous, and you may be more at risk if you have chronic kidney disease or are older.

How we can help

The Patient Support & Advocacy team will talk with you and your family about the risks and look at how these may be minimised with alarms, regular boiler maintenance and improved room ventilation. You may also be eligible for a free locking cooker valve, to help prevent gas leaks and fires.

Getting involved

Most of the services we offer aren't available through the NHS, yet they are so vital in helping people with kidney disease to live their lives to the full and improve their quality of life.

We spend over £4.5 million every year supporting kidney patients, their families and kidney healthcare professionals. We help over 3,000 individuals with counselling, debt advice and advocacy. Last year, we provided financial support of more than £800,000 to help people cope with unexpected bills and enabled families facing hardship to identify and claim more than £1.8 m in extra benefits.







However, as a charity we receive **no funding** from the government and can only meet the growing demand for our critical patient support services with the help of our incredible supporters, so that we can continue to be here for everyone affected by kidney disease.
